

OUTDOOR WORSHIP (PEACE PAVILION) COMMITTEE

The Outdoor Worship Committee was established in 2023 to take the next steps with usage of the Prince of Peace exterior campus. Our sole focus in 2023 was to assess the feasibility of an outdoor worship space based on the conceptual design work completed in 2022 and 2023. The committee consisted of Phil Sprague (chair), Jim Dickey, Evan Saunders, Mary Meadows, Dineen Terstage, Pastor Charlie Woodward, Steve Zinram. The committee met frequently during the year in conjunction with our architect, John Faile and Associates.

Tactically, we have made good progress on the Peace Pavilion in 2023. During the year we:

-Completed the preliminary design of the Peace Pavilion working with architect John Faile and Associates. This effort was funded by a generous grant from the Prince of Peace General Endowment Fund.

-Obtained design approval from the City of Westlake.

-Obtained a directional cost estimate within our budget of \$500,000 from Sciarappa Construction of Avon Lake.

-Completed a "silent" capital campaign which indicated several members are willing to contribute. We estimate that we have secured \$200,000 in funding over a three-year period. In addition, we have expanded the Capital Campaign seeking to raise a total of \$500,000.

Obtained Church Council approval to proceed to a special congregational vote on February 11th at the Annual Meeting.

-Released a Request for Proposal document to four qualified vendors to select a contractor. Received initial donations for the Peace Pavilion (Thank You!!!).

We have continued to refine our design to meet our requirements both aesthetically and financially.

Our goal is to obtain congregational approval in February, select a contractor, and obtain a building permit from the City of Westlake. We hope to break ground in the Spring of 2024 and provide opportunities to worship in the Peace Pavilion in 2024.




Travel Quest Event, The Hunchback of Notre Dame!

JGospel: Mark 1:21-28

21[Jesus and his disciples] went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught.22They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. 23Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, 24and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." 25But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" 26And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. 27They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another, "What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." 28At once his fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of Galilee.

Today's devotion is based on a sermon by Pastor Vince Gerhardy.

Words are such an important part of life. In an average day, we hear some 20,000 to 30,000 words. That doesn't count the words we see on the screen, or billboard, or emails and texts, which can easily double or triple that number.

So at the end of a long week, after hearing nearly 500,000 words from others and the media, you and I gather to hear the words of Jesus Christ. His words speak to our battered ears, battered minds, and battered lives. His words speak calmly and directly, equipping and encouraging us for another week of noisy living.

Again, this event is sometimes passed over as unimportant for us in these times or irrelevant. But you and I need to hear this message again and again. That is why we gather here after a week of depressing and defeating words to hear still more words. The difference is that these words we are hearing are the words of power, words of hope, words of authority and words of a loving Savior.

They are the words of Jesus Christ. We gather on a Sunday to hear the words of a Savior who frees us from the power of all evil that tries to overwhelm us. For I truly believe the words of Christ are as powerful today against evil as they were that day in the synagogue. Whenever evil seeks to distort and destroy our lives, the words of Christ have power to free us. So when evil whispers in your ear,

"It's no use, you can't do it, give up!" we turn to the words of Scripture, and there we hear the words of St Paul thunder in our ears, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me!"(Phil 4:13). When evil whispers the words,

"You're alone, there's no one who cares for you, and no one who will stand by you", Christ's word assures us, "I will be with you always, to the end of the age" (Mathew 28:20).

When evil whispers the words,

"You're a failure, no one can possibly love a person like you", the word of the Lord empowers us to carry on. "Your sins are forgiven" (Luke 5:20), we are told. "The mountains and hills may crumble, but my love for you will never end" (Isaiah 54:10).

When evil whispers the words,

"There is no hope and no help or comfort in the face of sickness and grief, a word comes from Christ,

"I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and they know me." "I will never forget you! I have written your name on the palms of my hands" (Isaiah 49:15).





When evil whispers in your ear,

"You're going to die and that will be end of you" and terror strikes your heart, Jesus comes with a word, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. I go to prepare a place for you. And I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. (John 14:1-4).

"All those who live and believe in me will never die" (John 11:26).

When evil whispers in your ear,

"There is no point in praying, don't waste your time. You have better things to do". The word of the Lord comes to us with authority, "When you call on me, when you come and pray to me, I will listen" (Jer 29:12).

When Martin Luther would get depressed or discouraged in his work, his mantra became, "But I am Baptized." But I belong to God. But when the game is over, the battle is done, God wins. How about letting God have authority in your life today? For God sent his son, Jesus the Christ the one who has authority, and the words of eternal life.

Let us pray: Compassionate God, you gather the whole universe into your radiant presence and continually reveal your Son as our Savior. Bring wholeness to all that is broken and speak truth to us in our confusion, that all creation will see and know your Son. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen
