



1 Peter 1:3-12 NRSV

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, 5 who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. 6 In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, 7 so that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. 8 Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, 9 for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

10 Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied of the grace that was to be yours made careful search and inquiry, 11 inquiring about the person or time that the Spirit of Christ within them indicated when it testified in advance to the sufferings destined for Christ and the subsequent glory. 12 It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in regard to the things that have now been announced to you through those who brought you good news by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven—things into which angels long to look!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

Peter's words to his fellow followers of Christ in the early church offer hope for us today.

Verse 6- "...even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials ..."

In the midst of the trials we face today, it may be hard to grasp the good that can come from it. Our focus turns inward, and we find ourselves wondering why God would allow bad things to happen.

May I say again that God is the giver of all that is good. God's desire is not to condemn the world. God loves what God created. God's desire is that world might be saved through Jesus Christ.

To "be saved" does not simply mean "I found Jesus!" and all my worries are gone.

To be saved is to be made whole, complete, worthy of God's love and favor in God's eyes. This is God's doing.

In the midst of our suffering, and you can fill in the blanks as to what that looks like for you today, God promises to be with us. And a result of that suffering, Peter states, is the hope that "the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed." (verse 7 above).

We don't hope for suffering. But we hope that from suffering, our faith may be strengthened.

A former church I had served had gone through some difficult days several years before I arrived. They were at the point of possibly shutting their doors and selling the building. But they persevered. Many longtime members of the church remembered those days as foundational. I came to appreciate their insight when difficult situations arose in the years I served there. Their experiences of the past gave them the strength to face the issues in the present.

These days we find ourselves can be a test to our faith and trust in God.

Join me in trusting God to make a way. God will never leave us, never abandon us, will always walk with us. And though we have not seen Jesus Christ, we love Jesus Christ, for we know that Jesus Christ is God's gift of love for us, and for all the world.

For Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed – ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, may we never forget the inheritance that is ours, imperishable, undefiled and unfading. We turn our eyes and our ears and our hearts to you, for your love is unconditional, your forgiveness complete, and your hope is eternal. Thank you. May we never forget. We pray this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.


