



- Filing congregational reports and correspondence



Mark 5:1-20

lesus Heals the Gerasene Demoniac

5 They came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gerasenes. 2 And when he had stepped out of the boat, immediately a man out of the tombs with an unclean spirit met him. 3 He lived among the tombs; and no one could restrain him any more, even with a chain; 4 for he had often been restrained with shackles and chains, but the chains he wrenched apart, and the shackles he broke in pieces; and no one had the strength to subdue him. 5 Night and day among the tombs and on the mountains he was always howling and bruising himself with stones. 6 When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and bowed down before him; 7 and he shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." 8 For he had said to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" 9 Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" He replied, "My name is Legion; for we are many." 10 He begged him earnestly not to send them out of the country. 11 Now there on the hillside a great herd of swine was feeding; 12 and the unclean spirits begged him, "Send us into the swine; let us enter them." 13 So he gave them permission. And the unclean spirits came out and entered the swine; and the herd, numbering about two thousand, rushed down the steep bank into the sea, and were drowned in the sea.

14 The swineherds ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came to see what it was that had happened. 15 They came to Jesus and saw the demoniac sitting there, clothed and in his right mind, the very man who had had the legion; and they were afraid. 16 Those who had seen what had happened to the demoniac and to the swine reported it. 17 Then they began to beg Jesus to leave their neighborhood. 18 As he was getting into the boat, the man who had been possessed by demons begged him that he might be with him. 19 But Jesus refused, and said to him, "Go home to your friends, and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and what mercy he has shown you." 20 And he went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him; and everyone was amazed.

This takes place across the Sea of Galilee in the land of the Gentiles. You won't find pigs in Israel – even today. They are considered unclean.

A story we were told on our last trip to the Holy Land by our guide is that there IS a pig farmer in Israel who has figured out how to raise pigs in a country where they are forbidden. The farmer has taken the law to be literal that states "No pigs are permitted on Israeli soil." So the farmer has built platforms on which the pigs are kept that keep their hooves off the soil. Talk about being creative.

Once again, I digress.

What I want to focus on is the response of the swineherds – those who just lost two thousand pigs. A major loss of their livelihood, yes? Can you imagine? Their main source of income, their daily life chores and focus are all gone.

They are not happy to have Jesus in town. They BEG Jesus to leave their neighborhood. Can you blame them?

And the one who Jesus heals, who is now clothed and in his right mind, thinks it wouldn't be a bad idea for him to join Jesus when he leaves town. If he stays behind, he will be a constant reminder of this swine massacre that just took place. Can you blame him for wanting to go with Jesus?

Instead, he does stay behind, and we are told: "And he went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him; and everyone was amazed."

A follower of Jesus, a Gentile, proclaiming the message of Jesus to the Gentiles.

How do we respond when things get turned upside down and inside out? How do we respond when the foundations of what we hold on to for safety and security and livelihood are shaken or destroyed?

Here is the good news. In the lesson today, healing and wholeness happen. When Jesus is present, we get a glimpse of the Kingdom of God – the blind see, the deaf hear, the lame walk, the mute talk, those who are broken are made whole.


It may disrupt what we hold on to for safety and security. But when all else falls away, what matters is the promise that we are God's beloved. For it is God's desire is to make whole that which is broken.

Let us pray: Almighty God, we bring before you the cries of a sorrowing world. In your mercy set us free from the chains that bind us, and defend us from everything that is evil. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen
