80% of strokes are preventable yet stroke is the No. 5 cause of death and a leading

cause of disability in the U.S. On average, every minute that a stroke goes untreated 1.9 million brain cells die.

Life Line Screening will be at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church on Friday, July 28th providing valuable health screenings to detect your risk of stroke and cardiovascular disease. Three key tests check for blocked carotid arteries (stroke risk), an irregular heart rhythm called atrial fibrillation and high blood pressure which are the three leading risk factors for stroke. Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and hardening of the arteries in the legs. The screenings are fast, painless, affordable and do not require you to disrobe. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and creactive protein screenings, as well as take-home colon cancer early detection tests.

THIS WEEK'S MEMBER PROFILE

Ian was born in Alma, Michigan and grew up with a younger sister, Leah. The family moved to Mt. Pleasant, Michigan when he was 6 months old. He lived there until his move to Ohio to attend college at Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, graduating with a Bachelor of Music in 2003. Initially he had majored in voice performance, but changed to Music Education after developing a strong interest in teaching in his first year. Returning to Michigan, he earned a Master of Music from Central Michigan University in 2004. Anakarine was born in Caracas, Venezuela and grew up with two younger sisters, Andreina and Andrea. She earned a Bachelor of Music from the Instituto Universitario de Estudios Musicales in 2001 and Earned a Master of Music from Central Michigan University in 2003. She had moved to the United States to attend graduate school in Michigan at age 29. In 2020, Anakarine completed a second Masters degree in information science from Kent State University.

After graduating from Oberlin, Ian returned to Michigan with a plan to live at home for the summer while looking for long-term teaching jobs. He had not landed a teaching position by the end of summer, so he decided to stay in Mt. Pleasant and take some grad school music classes at Central Michigan University. He met Anakarine on the first day of class (also his birthday) when they had both enrolled in a conducting class together. The grad level class only had four students, and many conducting practice activities required a partner, so lan and Anakarine started working together. Practicing conducting activities quickly turned into chatting over coffee, and 20 years later, they're still going strong!

Anakarine worked at the Detroit Waldorf School teaching elementary and middle school Spanish classes. After moving to Oberlin with Ian, she worked at the Oberlin Early Childhood Center overseeing a program called KidSmart on the Road providing art instruction in day-care programs throughout Lorain county. She works in the Lorain Schools as a substitute teacher and briefly as the POP office manager. Anakarine is seeking a position now in Library Science.

Ian began working in Lorain City Schools in 2004 as an elementary school general music teacher, and still holds a position there as the High School choir director. He was hired as the choir director at POP in 2012, taking over from Fran Wilhelm. He has worked at the MAD Factory, a non- profit theater based in Oberlin, performs in musicals, serves as a summer theater camp counselor, and works as a vocal coach for performers of all ages. Anakarine serves on the board of MAD Factory.

They have raised a family with three children - Daniel (30), Eva (14), and Matias (11). Ian and Anakarine feel blessed to be part of this welcoming community as they have offered their talents in many ways. Ian is the 11:00 cantor leading hymns and special music. He works with the hymn committee and puts together slides for the service. Beginning in July, he will serve as vocal coordinator for Crossfire, working with Chip to lead the band.

In their free time, they enjoy time with the family, TV/movies, and singing. Anakarine also relaxes while reading, drawing and painting. Ian has an interest in writing music and playing video games. He has worked as a music composer for video games and YouTube content creators for the last decade. Both have experienced many life enriching relationships. I know they will continue to give significant energy in their service here at POP. God has blessed them and you'll know that when you meet.

Romans 8:26-39

26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. 27 And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

28 We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. 29 For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. 30 And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

God's Love in Christ Jesus

31 What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? 32 He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? 33 Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34 Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. 35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? 36 As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all day long;

we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Three Words of Promise

Promise #1 – God Loves You

A few years ago, 132 people came together to play in the Bad Golfers Association tournament in Kansas City. The aim of their game was to reward the absolute worst golf player among them. In this organization, everyone is a loser, and that's okay. (4. Bill Geist, THE BIG FIVE-OH! (New York: William Morrow and Company, Inc., 1997), pp. 152-154.)

It is okay just to play golf for the sheer joy of playing. Some people beat themselves up if they can't play like Tiger Woods.

Some people bring that same competitive spirit to religion. They feel they must win God's love. Listen, you ARE loved. You are already a winner with God. Be a super-Christian if you are so inclined, but it won't change the way God feels about you.

Which brings me to Promise # 2:

Promise #2 - You belong to God

We read in the Gospel of John Jesus' words, "You did not choose me, but I chose you." God has always had us in mind.

The term used by Paul is that we are predestined to be God's children.

So what about predestination? Martin Luther himself struggled with this one. When he was a monk studying God's word, he was mentally and physically tormented by the question, "Am I one of God's elect? Am I one predestined to be saved?"

His superior, Johannes Staupitz, grew weary of Luther's questions and concern. he told Luther, "Martin, you are trying to peer into the divine majesty, as if you were God and could know the mind of God. You are not God and cannot resolve everything about the nature of God. You are starting at the wrong end of the sequence of questions. You are beginning with the unknown. Instead, start with the known, which means the wounds of the suffering Christ, the knowledge of God's act of love. Let the rest flow from there." (Martin Marty – Lutheran Answers to Lutheran Questions 20-21)

Later in his life, Martin Luther came to this conclusion: "Since God has taken my salvation out of my hands into his, make it depend on HIS choice and NOT mine, and has promised to save me, not by my own work or exertion but by his grace and mercy, I am assured and certain both that God is faithful and God will NOT lie to me, and also that God is too great and powerful for any demons or adversities to be able to break him or to snatch me from him!" (LW 33:289)

John 3:16 states that God so loved the world, and John 3:17 states that God's desire is not to condemn, but to save.

Promise #3 – Nothing can take that away

Did you see at asterisk at the end of St. Paul's words above? Neither did I!

There is NOTHING can take away the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Nothing!

Several years back when visiting my parents at their Assisted Living facility, I saw a woman who was staring at her car with a worried look on her face. I asked if she needed some help (I hoped that it was not too difficult because I am definitely NOT a mechanic!) The woman told me she had locked her keys in the trunk of her car.

I asked her if she needed help. She said she was trying to take things out of the back seat of her car to see if she could move the seat and get to the trunk. I asked, "Is there a trunk release lever in the car?" She thought for a moment and said, "Why yes, yes there is." She went to the front seat, lifted the lever, and the trunk popped open. Voila!

SO often we make it harder than it needs to be! We make it harder than it is.

Hear again the good news – There is NOTHING that can take away God's love for you and me. NOTHING. This is of GREAT VALUE. For God sees in YOU great value.

This is what we believe. This is what we proclaim. This is what we are called to share – the great gift of God – Christ has died, Christ is Risen. Christ will come again. The tomb is empty, and death is defeated, once for all! Promise!

Let us Pray: Thank you God for these promises. Help us to stop making it harder than it is. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
