

Prince of Peace - Peace Pavilion Projects

Some tasks are not included in the pavilion installation work and are to be provided by our congregation. This provides an opportunity to support this project by working together where individual skills and interest apply. Task descriptions are shown below. If you want to be included in one or more of the task groups, please notify Phil Sprague at (psrague@breezelineohio.net), text at 440-665-6284, or sign up on the sheet in the Lower Narthex.



Audio/Visual: The Peace Pavilion will have the same audio/visual capability as we have in the sanctuary. There will be a sound system and a large outdoor TV. This group will work with the pavilion contractor to implement installation of the required communications cables for the sound system and TV operation. Work will also include design and installation of "performance wiring" as required for the Contemporary Service and the Coffee House & Open Mic for example. Speaker mounting and installation is also required as part of this work.



Pavilion Cross Building: As shown on the pavilion renderings, a large wooden cross will be located on the upper roof of the pavilion. The design might be similar to the cross in front of the church. This group will design and construct the cross. Mounting will be done by the pavilion contractor. The cross will have LED lighting.



Bench Building: Our Peace Pavilion will have seating for 175 people on benches. Forty-Four benches are required and two have already been assembled as samples. Two benches can be easily converted into one picnic table. This group will assemble the remaining 42 benches and coordinate material purchases. Materials would be stored in the garage and construction done most likely outside.



Landscaping: Landscaping will add to the beauty of our pavilion. This group will develop a "landscape plan" and conduct the required fund raising to support this task. The goal is to add beauty while minimizing required maintenance. Some landscaping is included in the pavilion contractor's scope of work so congregational cooperation will be required. Plant donations from the congregation will be considered.



Peace Pavilion Marketing: The pavilion will enhance our worship opportunities as well as other church functions but it also must be marketed to the surrounding communities. This can be a major outreach tool and bring others to know us if we advertise it effectively. Pastor Charlie will lead this group.





PASTOR CHARLIE'S BLOG

John 12:44-50

44 Then Jesus cried aloud: "Whoever believes in me believes not in me but in him who sent me. 45 And whoever sees me sees him who sent me. 46 I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness. 47 I do not judge anyone who hears my words and does not keep them, for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. 48 The one who rejects me and does not receive my word has a judge; on the last day the word that I have spoken will serve as judge, 49 for I have not spoken on my own, but the Father who sent me has himself given me a commandment about what to say and what to speak. 50 And I know that his commandment is eternal life. What I speak, therefore, I speak just as the Father has told me."

These words of Jesus come at the end of his public ministry. In the following chapter, Jesus gathers with his disciples on the night he is betrayed, washes their feet, and gives them a new commandment to love one another. These words are a summary of his teachings. Throughout the Gospel of John there are references to darkness and light. In these final words, Jesus states it clearly – I have come as light into the world.

Like any good book, the summary brings us back to the beginning. In the first chapter of the Gospel of John, we read these words: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. (John 1:1-5)

Light reveals things that darkness hides. This can be a good thing. It can also be a scary thing. For the truth is that there are things that we wish could stay hidden in the darkness. We hide it in the deepest, darkest corner we can find, and we hope no one will ever find it. The light that shines in the darkness comes to you and me to shed light even on those dark places. But we need not fear, for the good news of Jesus Christ is that even the darkest crevices of our being, the things we wish could be hidden away forever, the deepest pits are not going to keep the light of Christ from shining in our lives, and the love of God filling our hearts. God knows you. God knows your joys, your sorrows, your highs and lows, the things you have done and left undone. God knows you, and everything about you. God knows the things you proudly display in the light, as well as the things you hide away in the dark. God knows you.

And the one God knows is the one God loves. The light of God breaks through the darkness, and light wins. A light brought into a dark room is not overcome by the darkness. The light shines in the darkness.

A quote attributed to Martin Luther King Jr. – "Darkness cannot drive out darkness: only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate: only love can do that." (A Testament of Hope: The Essential Writings and Speeches)

May the light of God shine in our hearts, and may the love of God be reflected in all we say and do!

One of my favorite hymns is "I Want To Walk as a Child of the Light." Kathleen Thomerson is the Organist and Music Director at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in Austin, Texas. "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light" is the only known hymn she has had published in any hymnals. She also wrote the tune for the hymn.

I want to walk as a child of the light. I want to follow Jesus.

God set the stars to give light the world. The star of my life is Jesus.

In Him there is no darkness at all. The night and the day are both alike.

I want to see the brightness of God. I want to look at Jesus.

Clear Sun of Righteousness, shine on my path, and show me the way to the Father.

In Him there is no darkness at all. The night and the day are both alike.

The Lamb is the light of the city of God. Shine in my heart, Lord Jesus.

I'm looking for the coming of Christ. I want to be with Jesus.

When we have run with patience the race, We shall know the joy of Jesus.

In Him there is no darkness at all. The night and the day are both alike.

The Lamb is the light of the city of God. Shine in my heart, Lord Jesus.

Let us Pray: Dear God, let your light shine in my life, in my heart, and in my home. Forgive me of the darkness your reveals, and free me to live as a child of your light, forgiven and set free. Shine in my heart, Lord Jesus. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Habitat for Humanity Fundraiser Walk we have narthered with

Prince of Peace offers many missions to engage our members in doing God's Work. As many know, we have partnered with Habitat for Humanity for many years with a goal of providing safe and affordable housing for families in need. In recent years, Habitat Cleveland has rehabbed or completed 30 new homes each year. What a gift to neighborhoods that have now blossomed into caring communities! A dedicated team of our volunteers car pool together several times each week. Of course, there are many skill levels offered, but all are welcome to participate.

A huge event is taking place at Edgewater Park on Saturday, July 20. Starting at 8 am, a yearly Fundraiser will begin along our beautiful lakefront. Everyone supporting Habitat is invited to enjoy healthy snacks, music, comradery, coffee, and of course Donuts! We pray for good weather as the 1 mile or 5K paths will be full. Many bring their 4 legged family members, and strollers are regularly seen with the next generation of walkers. Walkers work to secure pledges through an online site, the money is used to reinvest into upcoming projects. Pastor Charlie, Sue Hesse and Ron Kear will speak about this at an upcoming service. You can also talk with volunteers wearing the Habitat Walk shirts. Be sure to review the information in the lobby so you can get involved, the day is fast approaching.

Let me provide some background on our local Habitat Chapter. Pastor John and Mary Evans started a chapter in the 1970's. They did their own fundraising and built 20 homes in the early days. As they retired, they realized that to take this mission to the next level, a dynamic leader was needed. They found a man very knowledgeable in the trades and was involved in building the Cleveland Browns Stadium. Ron Kear accepted the role happily and has continued for the last 25 years! Ron Kear, is instrumental in planning our work and provides updates and hands-on training as needed. He makes sure our work supplies are ready at the job site, and tools needed are available. We often work with other volunteer groups and individuals committed to this cause. A team from various churches and other organizations often serve lunch, which was led many times by Becky Kear and POP members. This is a "well oiled machine" that knows how to get the job done. Other groups also work to beautify streets with new landscaping and repairs to existing homes.

As we have been Blessed, let us work to be a Blessing to others. You can see many Biblical principles at work here. A volunteer goes home feeling they "Have Loved their neighbor as themselves." I could write many stories to reveal many behind the scenes activities happening to support these efforts. I apologize for leaving anyone out as all contributions are equally important. The Comfort Quilters have provided a move-in package of blankets and personalized linens for each new home owner and family member. The Endowment Committee has stepped up to match the funds raised to put us as the number one walk team last year, and we are on track to repeat this year.

Habitat also works hard to prepare homeowners for the future. A rigorous application process is used to be sure the work we do will succeed when the keys are turned over. They will receive an affordable mortgage that can be repaid like most families have, and become contributing members of communities. New families must devote many hours at the site putting in their "sweat equity". They receive home maintenance training in classroom settings at the headquarters. Financial Literacy skills are also taught by staff. This ensures a "WIN - WIN" for all parties. Research has shown that children raised in a safe home with a loving family do much better in school and life!

Many local and national companies have joined the cause. Construction supplies and many other items are donated to complete the project. Paint, flooring, appliances, cabinets, plumbing, lighting and other items are regularly delivered as needed. The many people involved are too big to list, but know you can be part of this too. Volunteers are always needed, and if the work site is not your choice, Habitat has many other opportunities to help. The 3 "Habitat Re-Stores" in our northeast Ohio region accept donations of home items that are sold in their retail/ warehouse buildings. This is another way to contribute as they need cashiers, stockers, and any skill a retail outfit would require.


