Acts 5:1-11

Ananias and Sapphira

5 But a man named Ananias, with the consent of his wife Sapphira, sold a piece of property; 2 with his wife's knowledge, he kept back some of the proceeds, and brought only a part and laid it at the apostles' feet. 3 "Ananias," Peter asked, "why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back part of the proceeds of the land? 4 While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, were not the proceeds at your disposal? How is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You did not lie to us but to God!" 5 Now when Ananias heard these words, he fell down and died. And great fear seized all who heard of it. 6 The young men came and wrapped up his body, then carried him out and buried him.

7 After an interval of about three hours his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. 8 Peter said to her, "Tell me whether you and your husband sold the land for such and such a price." And she said, "Yes, that was the price." 9 Then Peter said to her, "How is it that you have agreed together to put the Spirit of the Lord to the test? Look, the feet of those who have buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out." 10 Immediately she fell down at his feet and died. When the young men came in they found her dead, so they carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 And great fear seized the whole church and all who heard of these things.

Two things before we get too far into this lesson. First of all, the person named Ananias in this passage is different from the Ananias who we read about in Acts 9 who meets Saul after Saul's conversion experience on the road to Damascus. Secondly, this verse begins with "But..." so it would be good to see what comes right before this.

Here are the verses from Acts 4 that proceed today's reading:

The Believers Share Their Possessions

32 Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. 33 With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. 34 There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. 35 They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. 36 There was a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"). 37 He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.

The early Christian church is just getting started, and the community begins to grow. To support this new movement, the community shares everything with everyone. Everything! Ananias and his wife Sapphira are set as examples of what happens when you DON'T share everything!

Talk about a powerful stewardship program! Wow! Give or else. So where is the good news found in the lesson today?

First of all, let us remember that God is the Giver of ALL. ALL that we have is a gift from God. And ALL that we have belongs TO God. Our life. Our Family. Our possessions. The very breath we breathe—gift from God.

These are gifts entrusted to us, and we are called to be stewards of it all. It doesn't belong to us, it belongs to God.

What would life be like if we lived that way? What would happen if a family would sit down to hear the reading of the will of their dear aunt, who collected many things and had accumulated a good sum of money over the years, and when the will is read, they hear these words: All of my earthly possessions belong to God. Always have, and always will. God entrusted them to me, and now, I entrust them to you. They are now in your hands, but remember, they ALL belong to God.

- The house belongs to God.
- The fine china belongs to God.
- The funds in the bank belong to God.
- The car, the furniture, the property all belong to God.

Is that truly how we view these things? Secondly, YOU Belong to God. In the waters of baptism, God has named you and claimed you as God's beloved. Through the promised Holy Spirit, you and I are equipped for every good work. And third, giving and sharing what God has given us also needs someone to receive the gift.

It had been a hard winter in the Appalachian area. The snow had piled up deeper and deeper, the mercury dropped, rivers froze, people suffered. The Red Cross used helicopters to fly in supplies. One crew had been working day after day—long hours. They were on their way home late in the afternoon when they saw a little cabin submerged in the snow. There was a thin whisper of smoke coming from the chimney. The rescue team figured they were probably about out of food, fuel, perhaps medicine. Because of the trees they had to put the helicopter down a mile away. They put on heavy packs with emergency supplies, trudged through heavy snow, waist deep, reached the cabin exhausted, panting, perspiring. They pounded on the door. A thin, gaunt mountain woman opened the door and the lead man gasped, "We're from the Red Cross." She was silent for a moment and then she said, "It's been a hard winter, Sonny, I just don't think we can give anything this year."

What has God given you?

A congregation member shared with me a lesson he learned from his Dad — "If it ain't worth sharin', it ain't worth havin'!"

Let us pray. Most Merciful God, we offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us — our selves, our time, and our possessions — signs of your gracious love. Receive them for the sake of him who offered himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen


