






Peace Pavilion Capital Campaign Status as of April 17, 2024

Goal = \$500,00



We have received commitments from our first wave of pledges of over 80% of our goal and pending approval at the April 28th Special Congregational Meeting, we look to begin the project in May. We are currently focused on short-term financing to complete the project and preparing for our meeting with you.

Jonah 2 New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)

A Psalm of Thanksgiving

- 2 Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish, 2 saying,
- "I called to the Lord out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice.
- 3 You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and your billows passed over me.
- 4 Then I said, 'I am driven away from your sight; how shall I look again upon your holy temple?'
- 5 The waters closed in over me; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped around my head
- 6 at the roots of the mountains. I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever; yet you brought up my life from the Pit, O Lord my God.
- 7 As my life was ebbing away, I remembered the Lord; and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.
- 8 Those who worship vain idols forsake their true loyalty.
- 9 But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Deliverance belongs to the Lord!"

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

So where is the most unique place you have ever prayed?

Ever pray from the inside of a fish? The Old Testament book of Jonah is just four chapters long. Jonah is a reluctant messenger of God, who is called by God to go to Nineveh, because its wickedness has come up before God.

Jonah agrees – Nineveh IS a bad place, and he certainly doesn't want to go there. So Jonah goes to Joppa and catches a boat to Tarshish – the OPPOSITE direction from Nineveh. While on the boat, God sends a storm, and the sailors realize someone has made God upset. They find out it is Jonah, so they rid themselves of the problem by throwing Jonah overboard.

God calms the storm – the sailors are safe. God calls a fish to swallow up Jonah. Jonah is safe. Well, as safe as you can be in the belly of a fish for three days! Now let me say here that I do not believe God sent us things like Covid-19 or cancer or broken relationships or hardship to punish or to teach us a lesson. God is love, and all God gives is IN love. God creates. God's desire is NOT that the world be condemned, but that WORLD might be saved through God. (John 3:17). Let's make that clear.

That being said, are you feeling the same way? The storm rages around us in whatever hardship or trial or pain we face. We seek refuge from the storm, and so we are swallowed up to stay at home. In the midst of the storm or trial you face, which I hope and pray for you is better than fish guts, can you find an opportunity to offer a prayer of thanksgiving?

Read again Jonah's words.

Death has been swallowed up, and new life is ours today. Take a moment and look outside – SPRING is SPRUNG. NEW LIFE.

Today is the day the Lord has made, no matter where you find yourself, let us rejoice and be glad in it.

For Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed - ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, I call out to you in my distress, and you answer me; out of the belly of wherever I am today, I cry, and you hear my voice. As I feel sometimes my life is ebbing away, my prayer comes to you. With a voice of thanksgiving I pray to you. For I know that deliverance belongs to You, O Lord!


