


GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY!

Construction Cost = \$521,793





PASTOR CHARLIE'S





John 14:1-6

14:1 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me.

14:2 In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?

14:3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.

14:4 And you know the way to the place where I am going."

14:5 Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?"

14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Christ is Risen!

He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

In one church, when Bibles were presented to 3rd graders, each child was to recite a passage of Scripture. On one occasion, everything was going well until the minister came to one little boy who could not remember his own name, let alone a Bible verse. The boy's eyes frantically searched for his mother, who was seated near the front row. When he spotted her, he was greatly relieved when she whispered to him, "I am the light of the world." To which he immediately stated, "My mother is the light of the world!"

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers. We give thanks to you for all that you have taught us. We give thanks for our mothers this day, for it is by their actions and their love that many of us are where we are in our faith journey. I know that is true for me. It is because of the love they have shown for us when we have felt unlovable, that we are able to love others. We love, because somewhere along the line, we were taught how to love.

Did you know that, after Christmas Eve and Easter, Mothers' Day is the largest attended Sunday of the year. I hope you join in with Mom in worship today, even if it is on-line instead of in person.

Today's Gospel is a familiar passage that I often suggest for families as we prepare a funeral for a loved one. Jesus words sound like something my Mom would say – "Don't be troubled. Believe in God. Believe me." Now I am not saying Mom should be seen as Jesus Christ, but there a hint of loving parenthood in Jesus' words. Don't be troubled. Believe God. Believe me.

Jesus offers these words to the disciples the night he is betrayed. In a few short hours, they will see Jesus arrested, beaten, humiliated, drug through the mockery of a trial, stripped and whipped, nailed to a cross and die. Don't be troubled. Believe God. Believe me. Jesus doesn't just offer words, but actions as well. Dying and rising, Jesus not only speaks of forgiveness and hope for new life, he provides for it with his own body and blood. Don't be troubled. Believe God. Believe me.

Jesus tells his followers that he goes to prepare a place for us – a dwelling place or room in God's eternal kingdom. Know this – God provides a place for us that will not disappoint. Don't be troubled. Believe God. Believe Jesus.

Uncertainty of what tomorrow will bring, let alone today, has been exhausting, frustrating, scary, worrisome and ... (I will let you add your own adjective here!). Know this – Jesus words are for you and me today. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God. Believe also in me." Consider it some good motherly advice.

Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed - ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, we need your words of assurance every day, and sometimes more than once! We turn to you. Remind us again of your promise to never let go. We believe. We pray this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.
