



These words from the Old Testament book of Job are often read at funerals, reminding us that there is hope for us, for our future will be in the presence of God.

We live in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection, but the fulfillment of that is not yet fully revealed. We are broken people in need of a savior.

The season of Lent, which begins this week, is the time for us to remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return. We are not immortal. Death is a part of who we are. The death rate is 100%.

So this season of Lent is not a time of praise and joy, but a more somber and inwardly focused season. For this reason, we put away the songs of "Alleluia" for the coming days.

From the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America website's page "Worship Formation & Liturgical Resources: Frequently Asked Questions" is this explanation:

Based on the Hebrew word, "hallelu yah," meaning "Praise the Lord," alleluia has been a word of great praise to God in the life of the church and was prominent in early Christian liturgies. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent in the Western church, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. The hymn "Alleluia, song of gladness" (Evangelical Lutheran Worship #318) contains a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.

### Alleluia, Song of Gladness

1 Alleluia, song of gladness, voice of joy that cannot die; alleluia is the anthem ever dear to choirs on high; in the house of God abiding thus they sing eternally.

2 Alleluia you are sounding, true Jerusalem and free; alleluia, joyful mother, bring us to your jubilee; here by Babylon's sad waters mourning exiles still are we.



3 Alleluia cannot always be our song while here below; alleluia our transgressions make us for a while forgo; for the solemn time is coming when our tears for sin shall flow.

4 In our hymns we pray with longing: Grant us, blessed Trinity, at the last to keep glad Easter with the faithful saints on high; there to you forever singing alleluia joyfully.



And so we bid farewell to Alleluia! These are the words we have used at the end of our worship services the Sunday prior to Lent: We are an Easter people. And Alleluia is our song. And yet, there comes a time when our songs of Alleluia subside, for a time. The season of Lent is that time.

### The author of Ecclesiastes writes:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.

A time to be born and a time to die.

A time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted.

A time to break down and a time to build up.

A time to weep and a time to laugh.

A time to mourn and a time to dance.

A time to keep silence and a time to speak.

As a sign of our repentance, we now say Farewell to the Alleluia as we enter into the season of Lent. We bid farewell to Alleluia until we will gather on that glorious Easter morning, and the song of Alleluia will be sung again. That will be the time. The empty tomb will be the place. But today, at THIS time and THIS place, we say farewell to Alleluia. Farewell, we will sing your praises again!

Let us pray: Almighty God, you alone are worthy of our thanks and praise. But now comes a time of prayer and reflection, and we turn to you. We will sing the Alleluia praises again, for we know that though we are sinners, and the wages of sin is death, you sent your Son who offers us the words of eternal life. Lead us in the Lenten journey. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen
