









Peace Pavilion Capital Campaign Status as of February 21, 2024

A NEW OPPORTUNITY STANDS BEFORE US

When I came to Prince of peace Lutheran Church three years ago, I was asked what is my vision for the future of this church. That is a difficult question to answer until you get to know the congregation. It's important to learn the history and the foundation on which the church is built. And then it's important to know the gifts, and to the passion of the congregation. Over time, that became clear to me. This congregation is a community that enjoys being together for worship and for service. The mission of the church sums it up — we are called to grow in faith, serve in love and live in peace. Building on that mission my vision has been and continues to be to make Prince of peace Lutheran Church a place where the gospel is proclaimed, where we can grow together as the body of Christ, and from where we can be sent out to be God's hands and feet in the world.

Over the past three years, we have focused on our outreach ministries. We put together an engagement book that includes the many different ways people can get involved in the mission and ministry, both inside the church and beyond our walls. We made some changes to the worship services, such as adding a confession and forgiveness and all the assigned readings for each Sunday. We also offer a children's sermon even when young ones are not present. The number of kids that come up for the children's sermon continues to increase. It's exciting to see.

We have partnered with other churches, both Lutheran and other denominations, to provide opportunities for confirmation ministry, worship, and fellowship. The Thanksgiving worship and Pie Fest is a great example of this. More opportunities are in the works, including the return of Vacation Bible School in partnership with other churches. We have encouraged people to get to know each other a little bit better, with the addition of name tags that we should be wearing every week! We have done some remodeling and repair work that needed to be done. And as of this year, we have proposed a balanced budget for the coming fiscal year, including a significant increase in the amount of money pledged to care for our facilities. We have welcomed new members, and our attendance has increased over the past three years. A new opportunity stands before us. The peace pavilion.

We have been talking about this for the past two years. It was introduced a couple years ago at the annual congregational meeting. Since then, there have been many meetings with the council and the pavilion team to consider what might work for us. Meetings with the architect, the city of Westlake, the staff and leadership and contractors have been involved. We have come to this day with the proposal to move forward with this project. Work still needs to be done to get the project within our scope of what we believe we can afford. I believe we will get there. This project is a part of my vision for the future of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. In my two previous congregations, we built outdoor shelters for worship and other uses. Other uses include parties, study groups, concerts, picnics, weddings, baptisms, funerals, family gatherings, community events, movie nights, Blessing of the animals, art fairs, and more. Both of my kid's graduation parties were held in the outdoor shelter at our church. When COVID hit, the outdoor worship space became a safe place for us to start worshiping together again. The opportunity for the community to utilize that space for various events is endless. The pavilion can be a place where our mission happens – to grow in faith, serve in love, and live in peace.

A NEW OPPORTUNITY STANDS BEFORE US

The shelter can be a way to extend hospitality. Several people shared with me that coming to worship at our church at an outdoor service was a great way to get to know the church before they entered the building for the first time which can be a little scary for a first-time visitor. I remember another member who had a very difficult time coming back into the church after her spouse passed away. The outdoor worship space was a place for her to reenter the life of the church.

We have the space to do it, and the setting in the woods is beautiful. The project includes a concrete path from the parking lot to the structure. The space will have benches that can also serve as tables, providing a multitude of set up arrangements. The shelter will allow us to be outside even if there is some rain in the area.

We have the space, and I believe the time is now. But one of the promises I make to you is that I will not support a project unless we have the funding to make it happen so that the church will not be saddled with any long-term debt. And that is where you come in. I ask for you to prayerfully consider your support of this project. My wife and I are on board. We are making a three-year commitment to the project. We are not decreasing our regular giving that supports the ongoing mission of the church. This is above and beyond our weekly offering.

The level you want or are able to give is up to you.

I encourage you to pray about it. Consider it. And if you feel so moved, I ask you to make a commitment to the project.

Phil Sprague will be available the next couple of Sundays to answer any questions you might have after worship. Me too. A congregational meeting will be held sometime next month for us to approve the project. Commitment cards are available outside the sanctuary doors and on the table where the building plans are located.

Warning to Pay Attention

2 Therefore we must pay greater attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it. 2 For if the message declared through angels was valid, and every transgression or disobedience received a just penalty, 3 how can we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? It was declared at first through the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard him, 4 while God added his testimony by signs and wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit, distributed according to his will.

9As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

We miss so much in life because we will not listen. Writer Charles Swindoll once found himself with too many commitments in too few days. He got nervous and tense about it.

"I was snapping at my wife and our children, choking down my food at mealtimes, and feeling irritated at those unexpected interruptions through the day," he recalled in his book Stress Fractures. "Before long, things around our home started reflecting the patter of my hurry-up style. It was becoming unbearable.

"I distinctly remember after supper one evening, the words of our younger daughter, Colleen. She wanted to tell me something important that had happened to her at school that day.

She began hurriedly, 'Daddy, I wanna tell you somethin' and I'll tell you really fast.' Suddenly realizing her frustration, I answered, 'Honey, you can tell me --and you don't have to tell me really fast. Say it slowly.'

I'll never forget her answer: Then listen slowly."

I don't know about you, but I am someone who likes to have music playing when I am working, or preparing a sermon or even out for a walk. I am guilty of filling my ears with lots of noise, which often blocks out my ability to listen and pay attention to what I am hearing.

A powerful example of paying attention is Mother Theresa. She was once asked about her prayer life.

The interviewer asked, "When you pray, what do you say to God?"

Mother Teresa replied, "I don't talk, I simply listen."

Believing he understood what she had just said, the interviewer next asked, "Ah, then what is it that God says to you when you pray?"

Mother Teresa replied, "He also doesn't talk. He also simply listens."

How powerful it is to know that God pays attention to you and me.

Doesn't God deserve the same?

And in our world of a lot of voices wanting us to hear what the voices are saying, may we pay attention to what we have heard. As Saint Paul writes to the church in Rome, "Faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ. (Romans 10:17).

Are you paying attention?

Listen.

Let us pray: Almighty God, forgive us when we fail to pay attention to what you have to say to us today. May we hear again your wonderful words of forgiveness and love. Guide us in the days to come to stop and listen. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen
