Peace Pavilion Highlights:

- We have commitments for 91% of the construction cost of the project and have received 62% of the funds for construction.
- When adding in ancillary items such as architect, financing, benches, audio/visual, etc. We have commitments for 85% of the total project (not including landscaping) and have received 60% of the funds.
- We had one family "step up" their commitment from Maple to Oak in October.
- We have about \$18,500 of remaining 2024 commitments expected to be received by the end of the year or about 3.5% more toward construction cost goal.
- We will need to recast our loan upon completion of construction and final payment. The more cash we get in by the end of the year the better to reduce our overall financing charge (currently estimated at \$43,000).
- Landscaping design is coming along well and we will have further opportunities for donations in the future.


Peace Pavilion Capital Campaign – Construction Cost Only Status as of November 19, 2024

Luke 2:1-7 (the Message translation)

About that time Caesar Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Empire. This was the first census when Quirinius was governor of Syria. Everyone had to travel to his own ancestral hometown to be accounted for. So Joseph went from the Galilean town of Nazareth up to Bethlehem in Judah, David's town, for the census. As a descendant of David, he had to go there. He went with Mary, his fiancée, who was pregnant. While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. She gave birth to a son, her firstborn. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the inn. Merry Christmas! For this year's Children's Christmas Program, I wrote the following poem to tell the story.

Mary and Joseph had come a long way to Bethlehem for a place to stay They tried at the Inn but were told there's no room they must have been filled with sadness and gloom

But soon they were given a place to stay not a fancy hotel but a barn filled with hay They weren't alone – there were cows and sheep in a stable that night, they all tried to sleep

But soon the time came for the babe to be born Jesus is here! Happy Christmas morn Surrounded by animals that kept watch all night Rejoiced with the angels at this blessed sight

The shepherds were doing their job that night watching the sheep by the stars and moonlight And then what a sight they see in the sky a bright light, an angel, God's glory, OH MY!

The shepherds were frightened, so scared and afraid they probably wished in their beds they had stayed But the angel said so peaceful and sweet "Fear not, I've got someone I want you to meet!"

The angel told them the good news of great joy the Savior has come and it's a baby boy He's there in a barn on the outside of town this king wears a diaper instead of a crown!

And then more angels appeared in the heavens, 10 thousand, a million and 10, or 11 They sang: "Glory to God Peace, Joy and Love God has come to the earth from heaven above"

Imagine the sight imagine the sound the angels, the glory of God shining round The song of the angels so lovely and sweet filled the shepherds with joy from their heads to their feet

"Peace on earth to women and men to children and animals and ALL, AMEN" May we join the chorus and lift up our voice the good news of Christmas – Rejoice, Rejoice!

When an angel tells you to go, you go! Don't dilly or dally, wandering to and fro. For a babe has come to set us free there in the stable, the shepherds will see

There as the angels had told them they found a babe wrapped in cloth, and animals round Mary and Joseph, proud parents they are and over the stable, they now see a star

Others will soon come to worship the king they will offer their gifts, and songs they will sing And all who are blessed of this sight to behold will share the good news, good news to be told

This Christmas may we remember this story Mary, Joseph the shepherds, the angels, their glory together with Wise Men they share news of great joy The good news of God's love for each girl and boy.

For unto us a Savior is born who comes to us on Christmas Morn This child is a gift given to us out of love the babe in a manger, sent from God above

A message that is not for us only to hear a message of hope and joy, not of fear a message for us to sing and to shout for Jesus is what Christmas is all about! Let us Pray. Almighty God, we join the song of joy this Christmas Day. Thank you for the gift you give us. For unto us is born a savior! We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.
