

From PC's PC (Pastor Charlie's Personal Computer!)

Matthew 20:17-28

17 While Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside by themselves, and said to them on the way, 18 "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death; 19 then they will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified; and on the third day he will be raised."



20 Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came to him with her sons, and kneeling before him, she asked a favor of him. 21 And he said to her, "What do you want?" She said to him, "Declare that these two sons of mine will sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom." 22 But Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?" They said to him, "We are able." 23 He said to them, "You will indeed drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left, this is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father."

24 When the ten heard it, they were angry with the two brothers. 25 But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. 26 It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, 27 and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; 28 just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

Moms can be so embarrassing! (Dads too!).

While we don't hear what the reaction is of the sons of Zebedee, I wouldn't be surprised if they were embarrassed by their mother's request of Jesus.

This is the third time Jesus had told his disciples that he would be crucified.

The first time, Simon Peter rebukes Jesus, and receives a rebuke in response from Jesus, who says, "Get behind me, Satan!"(Matthew 16)

The second time he tells them, they are greatly distressed, but no one speaks to Jesus about it (they remembered the response Peter got!). Instead, the disciples discuss who among them is the greatest. (Matthew 17 and 18) And now the third time, it is as if they had heard this message before – had they become numb to it? Instead of focusing on the message, Mrs. Zebedee boldly asked Jesus for a favor – some prominent seats when his kingdom is established. Would Jesus be willing to make to make that happen? James on one side, and John on the other?

So Jesus asked the boys if they would be able to drink the same cup that Jesus was about to drink. Their response? "Sure, why not. We can do that?"

In a few short days, Jesus will be in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night he was betrayed. From Matthew 26:36-40:

36 Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." 37 He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be grieved and agitated. 38 Then he said to them, "I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me." 39 And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want." 40 Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; Are you able? No.

If we were able, we wouldn't need a savior. In DaVinci's painting of the Last Supper, Mom gets her wish – seated on either side of Jesus at the table are James and John.

Yet when it comes to suffering and dying, as Jesus had told his followers three times, we find two criminals. When we look to find the King of kings and Lord of lords, he is on the floor, a towel around his waist, a basin at his side, washing the feet of his followers.

And when we look to find the dead body of the one who was crucified and laid in a borrowed tomb, we find two messengers announcing the news that the tomb is NOT where Jesus is to be found.

For each time Jesus shared with the disciples that he would die, he also told them he would rise after three days. As for seats in the kingdom of God? Jesus also told his disciples he goes ahead of them (and us) to prepare a place for them (and us). As I have said before, the kingdom of God is like Disney World in this way – there are no bad seats in the Kingdom of God.

Don't worry, Mom. Jesus has us covered!

Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed – ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, thank you for knocking us down when we get too high on ourselves. Thank you for lifting us up when we hit the bottom. Use us as your fellow workers in your vineyard to care for all of your creation, made in Your image. We pray this in the name of the Good Shepherd Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.
