

#### Mark 9:2-9

2Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, 3 and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. 4And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. 5 Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." 6He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. 7 Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" 8 Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

9As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. Jesus takes the disciples who come to be known as the inner circle — these disciples are with Jesus at the Mountain of Transfiguration and will be with him in the Garden of Gethsemane before his arrest on the night he was betrayed. There on the mountain, Jesus is transformed before their eyes. He shines with the glory and splendor they had never seen. And if that isn't enough, Jesus is not alone — standing with him are the pillars of their heritage — Moses and Elijah — the cornerstones of Law and the Prophets. A face shining like the sun, clothes of dazzling white, Moses and Elijah - something powerful is occurring on that mountaintop, but it is difficult for the disciples to comprehend. Just a few days earlier, Peter gets it right in his confession that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God, but his human limitation prevents his understanding of what that confession will mean.

In his attempt to make sense of the magnificent transformation taking place before his eyes, Peter tries to talk it out, to speak words for the unspeakable. He wants to build three dwelling places, three holy places to worship these three.

Peter's predicament reminds me of the great baseball announcer, Jack Buck, who was calling the World Series Game 1, LA Dodgers vs the Oakland A's in the late 1980s. The Dodgers were down 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth inning – two outs and a man on. Out of the dugout and up to the plate came Kirk Gibson (former Detroit Tiger). He had not played at all that night – he had two bad knees and barely able to walk. And yet, Gibson hit a home run. He was barely able to make it around the bases. Jack Buck's famous quote that night, "I can't believe what I just saw."

While Peter is still speaking, a bright cloud overshadows all of them and a voice interrupts his speech: "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him."

There are times when it is best to be quiet.

Sometimes it is best to just be quiet. Sometimes at amazing scenes, the newscasters have learned to just let the audience soak it in. That is what James and John did. Peter couldn't be kept quiet, until the cloud covered them, and the voice spoke. This is MY Son, my beloved, LISTEN TO HIM.

When the cloud clears and the company is gone, Jesus touches the disciples, calms their fears, raises them up and takes them back down to the valley. They tell NO ONE what has just occurred. Why? Maybe because it was impossible to put into words. Or maybe because Jesus had told them that his mission is not yet fulfilled. Jesus does not come to us so that we can worship him on a mountain. No, he comes to take away the sin of the world. The journey to the cross begins.

At the end of that journey, another vision on a hill takes place. This one stands in stark comparison – Instead of a high mountain, it is a hill outside of the city walls of Jerusalem. Instead of shining forth in glory, Jesus is a vision of shame. Instead of clothes dazzling white, his clothes have been stripped of him, gambled away by the Roman soldiers keeping guard. No longer is Jesus flanked by Moses and Elijah - at the cross there are two criminals facing a similar gruesome fate. No words of Peter celebrating the glory of Jesus, for at the cross, Peter is hiding away after denying knowing Jesus three times. The voice of God is replaced by the voice of a Roman soldier – but here, yes here is where things tie together – for even the soldier at the foot of the cross confesses that Jesus is the Son of God.

Like Peter and the other disciples, we are also invited to LISTEN TO HIM – God speaking to us through the Word – Jesus himself, the Word made flesh. We, too, are offered the touch of the savior, who reaches us in our fear and trembling, our bumbling and stumbling.

Let me take this opportunity to invite you to the journey of Lent. I believe there is no better invitation than the invitation given by God on the mountaintop to his followers – this is Jesus, my beloved – LISTEN TO HIM! We, like Peter, find ourselves filling the silence with words and ideas, plans and projects, lists to be done, activities to join in. How can we listen when we aren't taking the time to do just that. May we, like Elijah, find the opportunity to hear God speak in the still small voice. May we take heed to the words of the Psalmist who shares God's invitation with us, "Be still, and know that I am God." May we take the opportunity given to us by our church calendar to enter in to Lent to listen to God. My invitation to you today is this – give up something for Lent. BUT, may that thing you give up be the thing that is getting in your way of following this command to listen. The radio. The TV. The internet. Give up some of that time and give it to God – fill it with a time of devotion and a time of prayer. As we enter the season of Lent, there is opportunity for us to be quiet, and listen. When was the last time you really stopped to listen to what God is saying to you? When

was the last time you sought God's opinion on a decision in your life? When was the last time you changed direction in your life because of what God had to say? Are you afraid of what you might hear?

Listen, God is ready to tell you wonderful words - words of forgiveness. Words of hope. Words of love. You are my child. I love you. Listen!
